MEMO – MESSAGE RE : 2011 COMPETITIONS

Date : September 12, 2011

The purpose of this message is to bring to the attention of research administrators procedural changes that will affect the handling of grant applications to SSHRC this year. Please note the following. We would appreciate if you would communicate to and reinforce with your researchers and assist SSHRC to ensure follow-up.

Discussion of proposed budgets: This is a reminder that within the new program architecture, revised assessment criteria (Challenge, Feasibility and Capability) were introduced and applied to all new grants funding opportunities. To be successful, a proposal must receive a passing score in all three criteria.

The appropriateness of the proposed budget and the justification of the proposed costs are a sub-criterion under the Feasibility criterion and adjudication committees are asked to focus on assessing the overall merit of the proposal, whether or not it is a costly or modest proposal. Proposals with reasonable and well justified budgets will permit the peer review committee to focus on assessing the overall merit of the proposal, and if the proposal is successful, the budget will NOT be significantly be adjusted by adjudication committees. However, proposals with budgets judged by the committee to be inappropriate with respect to the activities described (whether too large or too small) should result in a low or failing feasibility score.

Final reports: In keeping with the new Federal Government Transfer Payment Policy and SSHRC's commitment to reporting on results and outcomes, the following reference has been made consistently in literature pertaining to the grant competitions in the new program architecture (Partnership Development Grants, Partnership Grants [LOI and formal application]), Insight Development Grants and Insight Grants). *Applicants who have received a SSHRC grant of any type but have failed to submit a final research report by the deadline specified in their Notice of Award are not eligible to apply for another SSHRC grant until they have submitted the report.* SSHRC will communicate with past award holders who have one or more final reports outstanding in the last five years to remind them to submit the report promptly to avoid being declared ineligible should they apply in a 2011 grant competition. These reports are used to communicate, and promote the value for, and contributions of social sciences and humanities research results among researchers, to Canadian society and the world. Please see the attached document as an example. SSHRC administers public funds, which includes tracking and reporting on the outcomes of its investments. Eligible institutions and researchers share this responsibility.

Did You Know? A Week of SSHRC-Funded Research Results

BACKGROUND

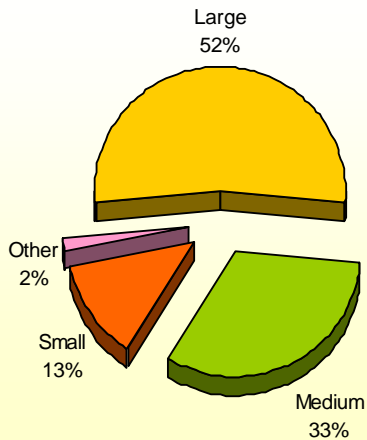
In order to foster timely sharing of outcomes and results information, the Corporate Performance and Evaluation Division regularly surveys its information repository for recent Final Research Reports (FRR) submitted by SSHRC funded researchers. Between July 12th and July 16th 2010, SSHRC received 184 final research reports (see Annex A). They provide rich insight into the nature and extent of our research investments and their implications.

The following is a quantitative and qualitative snapshot of the accomplishments of recently concluded research as seen through the eyes of SSHRC-supported researchers. This demographic picture touches on such themes as the outcomes of research, major success/hindrance factors associated with the research effort, the level of financial contributions from research partners and other sources of funding, and the employment opportunities for students enabled through the SSHRC grant received.

SELECTED KEY HIGHLIGHTS OF SOCIAL SCIENCE AND HUMANITIES RESEARCH

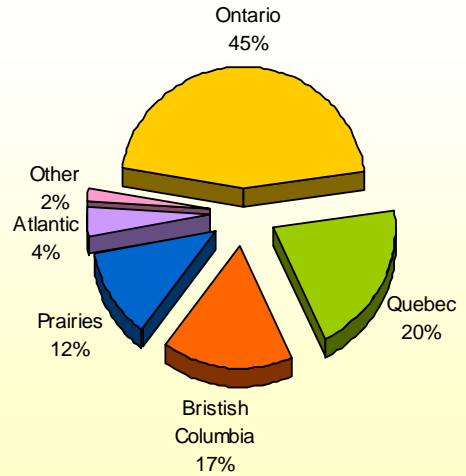
- **Research Timing.** Over 95% of the final research reports submitted were for the Standard Research Grant (SRG) competitions between 2000-2007;
- **University Size/Region.** Just over half of the reports came from researchers from large universities. Most of researchers were located in post-secondary institutions in Ontario (45%) or Québec (20%);
- **Discipline Cluster.** Research reflected all disciplines and domains, of which 63% in the social sciences, 34% in the humanities and 3% in Interdisciplinary Studies;
- **Leveraging Financial Funding from Other Source.** Over 20% of the grants attracted additional financial support beyond SSHRC, amounting to \$4.8 million. Partner contributions represented 3% of this total with the remainder coming from “other sources.” When additional financial contribution was forthcoming, for every \$1,000 invested by SSHRC, over \$200 on average was contributed by research partners and over \$1,300 was leveraged on average from “other sources.” Thus, the overall ratio of SSHRC funding to partner contributions/“other sources” was 1:1.5.
- **Student Employment.** Over 55% of SSHRC-funded researchers employed approximately 1-5 students with their SSHRC grants, compared to 35% of researchers who employed 6-10 students for their research.
- **Success/Hindrance Factors.** The majority of researchers indicated that SSHRC funding (65%) was the most important factor that contributed to the success of their research, followed by availability of/access to data (12%) and access to qualified students (8%). At the same time, nearly 30% of researchers reported no hindrance factors that impeded the research. Where hindrance factors are cited, these include issues such as release time (17%), availability and access to data (14%) and sufficiency of SSHRC funding (8%).
- **Outcomes of Research.** Approximately 32% of researchers signaled that the research results definitely had socio-economic implications, with 21% having potential for development of policies and program and 12% likely contributing to public debate. The majority of researchers (97%) indicated that their research had been disseminated to academic audiences, both nationally and internationally. At the same time 40% indicated that the research findings would likely have repercussions for policy-makers and 40% indicated that they addressed issues of interest to Canadian public. Over 45% of researchers reported that their findings affected teaching and professional practice, and 38% reported that they have significance for international collaboration.

University Size



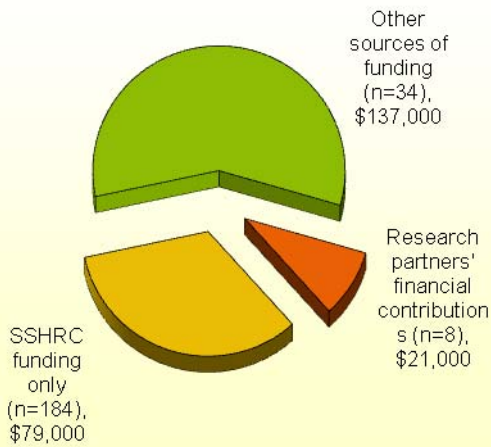

Region

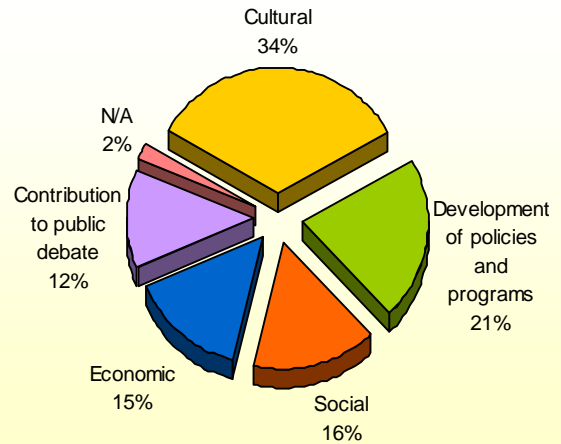

Sources of Funding Support (average, \$)

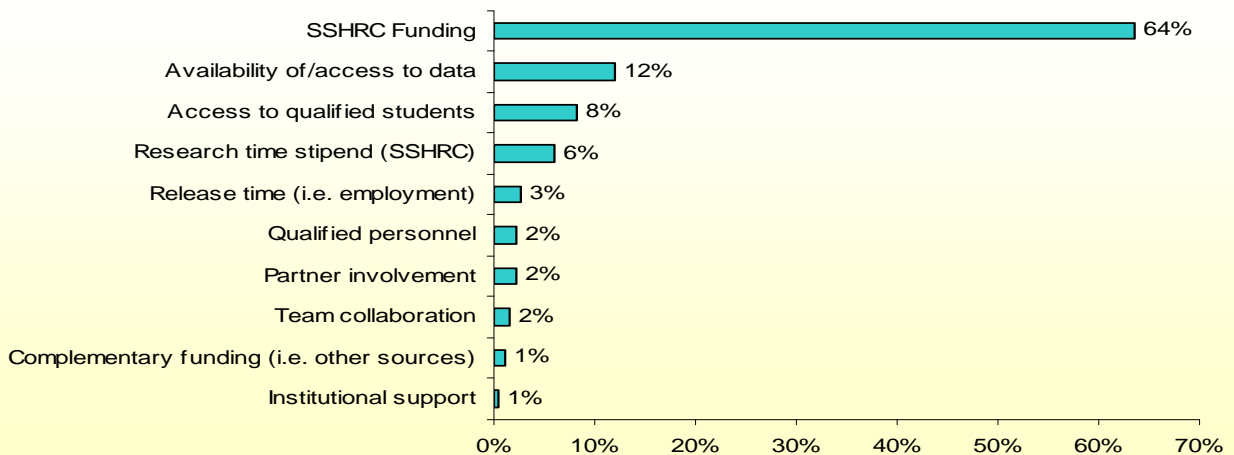


Areas of Impact



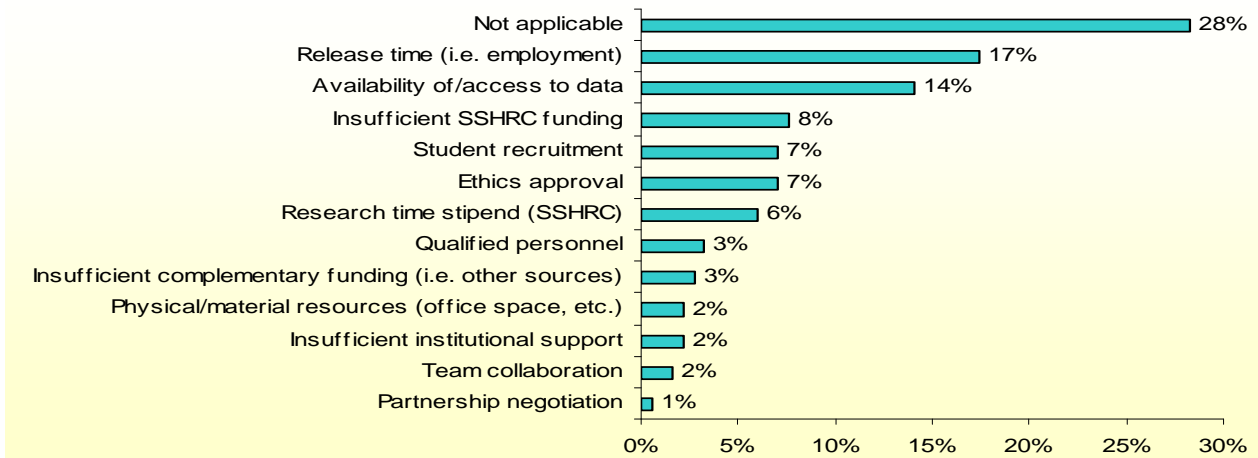

Success factors of research



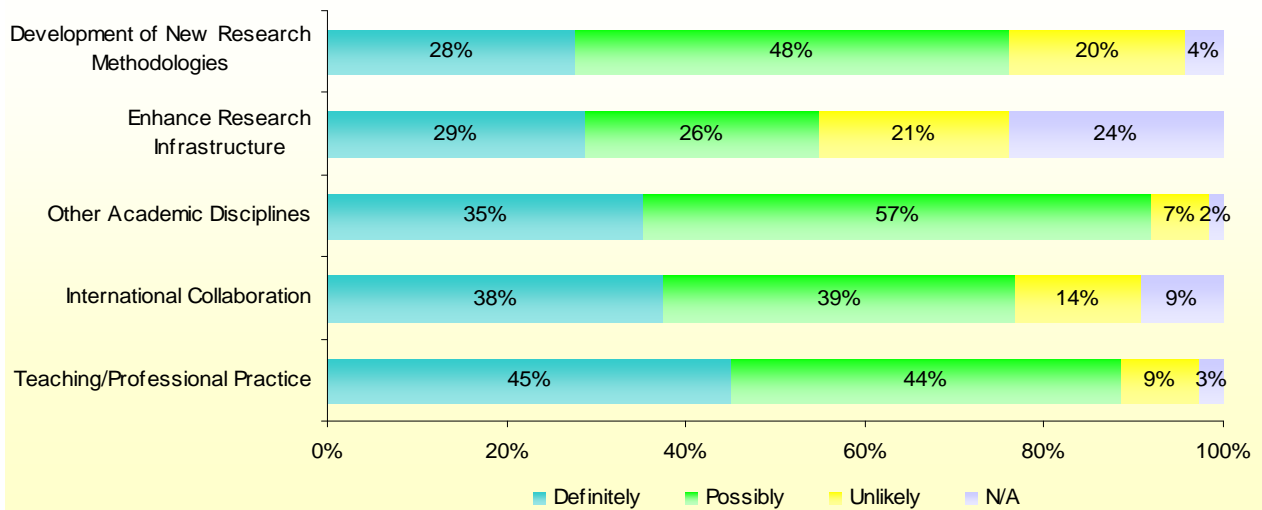

Hindrance factors of research



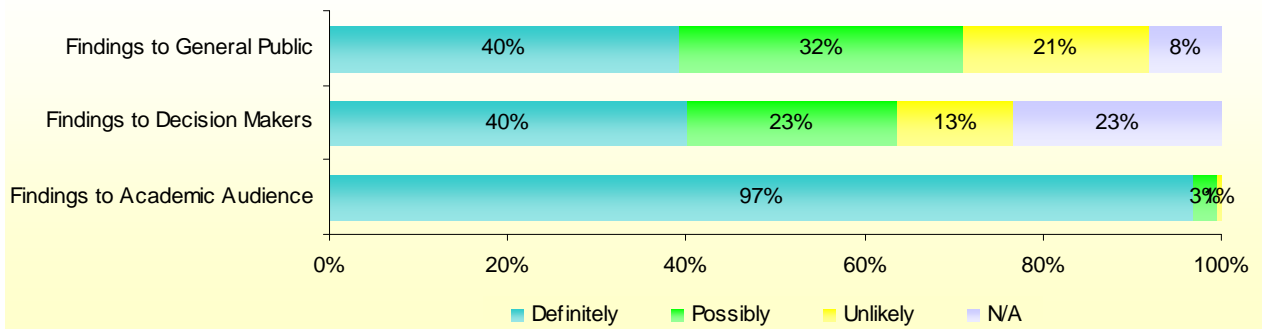
